We plan to have all the self-generated narratives off of Health EMS by the first of the year. ESO will not have a self-generated narrative option, so the sooner you become familiar with the new format, the easier the transition will be.

With holiday season among us it is always a good time to remind ourselves of good safe driving habits and increase awareness. Traffic will be increasing on the highways as well as increase pedestrian traffic. Always stay aware of surroundings and get there safe! We all know the focus is on prehospital and driving so please be the solution and not the topic of discussing. Wear your seatbelts, stay off the phones and drive respectfully.

Polk County Updates

We are now tracking every time a truck goes to fleet for service or repair of any time. Please send an email to **Kevin Schoen** when a truck leaves pre hospital and when it comes back. please include date and time, truck number, and issue. I also need emails and write on the white board when there are issues with the truck, fuel cards, etc.

I have hired a new EMT for the U shift. Jerry Daily is his name, he is on the Urbana Fire and Rescue Department, so he does have a little experience. He has been working as night dispatcher for Dallas County also. He will be in the next orientation class and you will soon see him on the trucks. Please help welcome him.

Starting Saturday, we will be doing week long truck rotations. The why is to keep miles down on the trucks. The rotation schedule will be put on the white board on the west side of the garage. Your cooperation is paramount to make this work.

It has been brought to my attention the condition of the trucks. We all know that part of our job is to make sure that the ambulances are clean and professional in appearance. This has not been happening lately. I need this to change immediately.

I know we are comfortable down here in our little area, but, I have noticed that some face sheets are left laying around. We are not the only people in this area. This is a HIPAA violation and needs to stop immediately. We are not finished with our call until the call is logged and the face sheet is placed in the crew office.

Everyone needs to be signed up for the driving class. This is a MANDATORY CLASS that needs to be completed before the end of the year. EVERYONE needs to be signed up and in a class before 1/1/2020. If you have not completed the class before the end of the year, you will be taken off of the truck. Please refer to the class schedules posted in this newsletter. There are ONLY 2 dates left!!

I completed performance center evaluations in September, and I think I will go on a rant here. We do quarterly competencies and we have HEALTHSTREAM education monthly. It amazes me how often the employees are not completing either. We have 4 to 5 HEALTHSTREAMS a month, there is no reason that this cannot be accomplished before the end of the month. Competencies are once a quarter with several opportunities to complete your competency requirements. Continuing Education is a job requirement. This is a measure for us to determine if you can care for patients properly, and if not, to educate you on the proper technique. I have worked at other agencies in the past where if you did not do your competencies, they would terminate you. I just feel if this is part of your job it should be a priority to get it done. I challenge everyone to get in gear and get your HEALTHSTREAMS done on time and to be at EVERY competency this year.

Life and Times from the Beautiful Stockton Lake

Well summer is almost gone and winter is soon to be up on us, just wanted to take to a moment to remind each and every one to take time now and to get ready for the cold weather that is moving into our area.

- IV warmers don't forget to plug them in and cover the fluids with a towel to be ready not if but when you need the warm fluids.
- Heavy warm blankets stock up now, does everyone remember last winter you couldn't find one if you needed one, and yes we needed them,
- Pre-makeup winter bundle for your cot with a heavy blanket and lay it out on your cot and roll it up and place it on your bench maybe two of these, so if you need one you have it ready to deploy on the cot.
- Review our Hypothermia Protocol now before you need it, just remember to quickly get those patients laying on the ground up and place a blanket under them even if you have to place a blanket on the backboard to start the warming procedure.
- Don't forget to protect yourself, dress for the weather and bring additional clothes in case you get wet, you can always take off, so dress warm, and don't forget your head.
- Snow chains, review this with you and your partner before you need to deploy them.
- Place a jug or two of **kitty litter** in your Ambulance sometimes that's all you need to get out of a slippery spot.
- Remember wind chill KILLS, even the little things like pocket hand warmers can save you or your digits.
- Keep the heat up in the back, you might be dressed for the weather, but when you put that patient in the back and you start removing clothes they will be cold really quickly.
- Linen (Blankets, Sheets, Pillows ect) folks these cost CMH mega bucks each year due to staff leaving them at patients' homes, at receiving hospitals ect. Do your part and

Everyone needs to do their part in order to prevent the criss crossing of responders and ambulances and delaying in patient care.




